2019 was not without its challenges. Together, we confronted a growing refugee crisis, a staggering economy leading to higher need for food and basic goods, and political unrest which brought Ecuador to its knees for months. Because of you, not only did we make it through, but we delivered aid to those who needed it most.

This year, we welcomed two new organizational partners: Mirame, a women's empowerment initiative, and the Cuenca Soup Kitchen, an effort to provide nutritious meals to Venezuelan refugees and homeless individuals.

You also helped us launch a successful new campaign, All Children Deserve to Dream, which is encouraging children and teenagers to dream big and acknowledge that they are valuable members of society.

Our work to empower local nonprofit leaders continues in the Community Assistance Program (CAP), which has made us a hub for education around social issues and leadership. CAP members have shown significant growth since the program's launch in 2017, but that does not mean our work is done here. We are committed to standing with these leaders and providing impactful learning opportunities for years to come.

Last but not least, I am delighted to share great news about Hearts of Gold's financial stability. In 2019, we altered our fundraising strategy to incorporate the talents of our dedicated volunteers and strategically cut costs where we could afford to do so. I would like to send a special thank you to our social committee, headed by Franny Hogg Lochow , our volunteer coordinator, Amy Montiel, and our advisory committee, for their unwavering commitment to build an Ecuador where every individual enjoys a life of dignity, hope and empowerment.

EDUCATOR.

Hearts of Gold hosts educational workshops in areas such as fundraising, communication & marketing, leadership, and self care to train and prepare nonprofit leaders and their staff.

In 2019, Hearts of Gold offered 85 hours of educational workshops.



MENTOR.

Hearts of Gold works hand in hand with nonprofit leaders to set goals, make strategic plans, and make sure lessons learned are put into action in a sustainable manner.

With a new focus in the Community Assistance Program, Hearts of Gold offered 480 hours of mentoring and direct services.

Hearts of Gold fundraises and manages funds for other nonprofits and initiatives in Ecuador. Over 8 years we have built a relationship of trust and transparency with our supporters.

Hearts of Gold stewarded funds for 7 organizations that serve children, women, individuals with disabilities, homeless, and more.




COLLABORATOR.

Nonprofit network in action: Pioneros de Cambio

Inspired by the leaders who felt isolated and alone in their work, Hearts of Gold launched the Pioneros de Cambio ("Changemakers) nonprofit network to create a community where leaders can come together to learn from one another, share their struggles, and find creative solutions. Since 2018, the network has grown to include 79 changemakers who are building a better Ecuador by supporting causes from youth and women's empowerment to cancer advocacy and immigrants rights.

We are no longer alone. We walked next to Hearts of Gold Foundation and all the leaders and changemakers from Pioneros del Cambio.

We believe that nonprofits are the backbone of a strong society. We support, inspire, educate, and invest in community leaders and grassroots organizations and their staff to make their work sustainable, efficient, and impactful.

Workshops & training

Our specialized curriculum was launched in 2017 based on an extensive evaluation of nonprofit strengths, weaknesses and expressed concerns. Our educational courses target six core areas of nonprofit development:

- Strategy
- Fundraising & donor management
- Communication & marketing
- Programs
- Leadership
- Finance & governance

1-on-1 mentoring

After three years of positive impact in our capacity building work, our community leaders expressed interest in greater personalized educational opportunities. In 2019, Hearts of Gold boosted our mentoring program to ensure that leaders have the knowledge and tools to make sustainable change in their organizations.


GET TO KNOW OUR PARTNERS

KALLPA WARMI

Building a strong, entrepreneurial network of rural women in Sayausi Fights for women's rights by establishing individual and collective responsibilities through social projects in agriculture, entrepreneurship, and education/training.



CETAP-LUCY

Supporting early childhood development and education in rural Chilcapamba CETAP-Lucy provides preschool programs, after-school programs, various disability and trauma therapy programs, sexual education courses, and individual and family counseling to 35 youth from low-income families.



FUNDACIÓN EL ARENAL

Providing educational support and food security for 65 youth in the urban El Arenal district
This community center offers a safe haven for children and teenagers with their after-school program, an educational counseling program, and a nutritional lunch program.



NOVA

Offering the only inclusive education program in Cuenca for children with disabilities.

NOVA is an inclusion school where special needs children and normal children are educated together, fostering acceptance and compassion between children.



CUENCA SOUP KITCHEN

Feeding 170 individuals in need everyday.

Thanks to their efforts, refugees from Venezuela and Ecuadorians living in poverty always have a secure place to turn for a nutritious meal.

The orphanage hosts and cares for children with special needs, ranging in extreme cases of Cerebral Palsy, paralysis, autism, and others, prioritizing including nutrition, special education, physical and occupational therapies, medical treatments.

Empowering women in Cuenca and beyond.


In a country where women's voices are sometimes silenced, Mírame is doing critical work to empower women through workshops, training, and community building.


